
















Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in conducting the ATS Awareness Raising Campaign across the country of Lags

Parallel with the success of the elimination of opium cultivation and addiction, ATS has emerged as a very serious problem. ATS trafficking and abuse used to be seen only in the urban areas but now it is found throughout the provinces, in both urban and rural areas including former opium growing areas in the northern provinces. The survey of educational institutions removed that ATS was commonly abused. 15-19 years olds are the most susceptible age group. Sample urine tests conducted on 14,250 students from 99 schools in 17 provinces from 2003 to 2005 have shown that the ATS abuse has increased significantly.
